## Libraries consultation

## Introduction

Libraries you use

A significant proportion of the resources the council use to provide services to the Island's community are received from the government in the form of an annual grant. As a result of the national austerity agenda the amount of grant funding available to the council is reducing to the extent that it needs save some £28 million over the period 2014/15 to 2016/17 in order to stay within its predicted budget in each of these years.

Consequently, the council is prioritising its spending to those services which it must provide by law but without going beyond what is required. The council's view is that it could save some 19% of the current spend on the library service (£280,000) whilst still meeting its obligations if it were to change the way it delivers the service.

The Isle of Wight Council is seeking the views of local people on a plan to change the way it delivers its library service with greater community involvement in the running of local libraries. The council is proposing that Cowes, Freshwater and Ventnor libraries operate in premises which are shared by and funded by local partners.

This is a third kind of library, a 'community supported' library. This will be a cross between a 'full community' library, entirely managed and paid for by the community and a 'full branch' library which is entirely funded by the council.

The council is also reducing the amount of money spent on library books across the Island, streamlining and reducing its managerial, administration and support functions, and reducing staffing in its libraries.

## The three proposals we are consulting on are:

- 1 community supported libraries;
- 2 changes to the mobile library service;
- 3 reduction in opening hours in the three proposed community supported libraries.
