

TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

REPORT 43/21

The purpose of this Report is to propose the use of the Town Council's Co-option Policy to fill the vacancies following the Local Elections on 6 May in each of Bonchurch & Ventnor East and Lowtherville Wards.

NO. DETAILS

I) BACKGROUND

- a) The revised Ward boundaries for Town Council elections provide for two Members in each of Bonchurch & Ventnor East and Lowtherville.
- b) The Local Elections have only filled one of the vacancies in each of these two Wards.
- c) Unlike Casual Vacancies that arise during the four year term of a Town Council, those left by the Election process itself are not filled through an advertised bye-election but straightforwardly though the use of the Co-option Policy

2) CO-OPTION POLICY

- a) Ventnor Town Council's Co-option policy sets out the following stages:
 - The vacancy will be advertised locally, requesting people to put their names forward for co-option by letter or email to the Town Clerk.
 - All replies will be circulated to members of the Town Council for consideration and the Town Clerk, in consultation with the Mayor, will arrange a date for a special meeting open to all the then current Members and attended by at least a majority of them where candidates for co-option will be asked to make a short presentation.
 - An applicant endorsed by the special meeting will be recommended to the earliest full meeting of the Town Council for co-option to it.
- b) Normal practice has taken 'presentation' to mean a verbal statement around the reasons why the applicant has expressed an interest in joining the Town Council

3) RECOMMENDATION

The Town Council is recommended to ask its Clerk to implement its Co-option Policy in respect of the current vacancies in Bonchurch & Ventnor East and Lowtherville.
