

TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

The purpose of this paper is to ask Members to consider approving the provision of an external, 24x7 accessible Defibrillator in the centre of the town.

No. DETAIL

I) BACKGROUND

- a) Councillor Jim Toogood has carefully researched the need for an additional Defibrillator in the town, potential sites for its placement and the cost of its purchase and installation.
- b) He recommends that the Town Council makes and funds that provision.

2) EXISTING PROVISION

- a) Each of the Doctor's Surgeries hold a Defibrillator but they are of course only accessible during their opening hours.
- b) The Ambulance Service have kindly donated one to be installed externally on the First Aid Hut.
- c) That is a very welcome addition to the availability of potentially life-saving equipment but clearly is not accessible for emergencies that may arise in the town's central areas.

3) LOCATION

Councillor Toogood's discussions with potential site owners have resulted in an offer from Seasons for a Defibrillator to be installed on their outside wall.

4) Cost

- a) The machine that Councillor Jim Toogood recommends would cost £1,640 to purchase and require a further £137 for fitting and electrical connection.
- b) Additional costs would be up to £230 to replace and relocate a noticeboard to clear the site for the installation and £120 to train 12 volunteers in the machine's use.
- c) The total of £2,127 is affordable from the surplus accumulated during the financial year.

5) RECOMMENDATION

The Town Council is recommended to approve the purchase and installation of a Defibrillator as identified in this Report.
