

The purpose of this report is to provide Members with information from an initial meeting about changes to local services following the Isle of Wight Council's requirement to reduce its Budget by £28M over the next three financial years.

#### No. DETAIL

### I) CONTEXT

- a) The Town Council's Budget for 2014/15 includes a ring fenced element of £46,000 to provide for maintaining local services that have their Isle of Wight Council (IoWC) funding withdrawn as far as is possible.
- **b)** This significant increase in the Budget, and the consequent impact on the Precept was fully supported by the Annual Consultation Meeting of 27 January 2014.
- c) At that stage there was no information available to the Town Council as to precisely which services would have their funding withdrawn, when that would happen or how much delivery to the current standards has been costing.

#### 2) INITIAL MEETING

- a) The senior staff of the IoWC's Recreation, Leisure and Public Spaces service invited all the Island's Town & Parish Councils to meet with them individually to discuss the impact on their area.
- b) In response, the Mayor, Town Clerk and Assistant Town Clerk met with Head of Service Alex Minns, Commercial Manager Sean Newton and Recreation & Public Spaces Manager Lee Matthews at Enterprise House on Thursday 20 February.
- c) Information on their range of current services and their calculated costs for Ventnor was made available at the meeting and a useful and thoroughly co-operative discussion took place around the issues of affordability and the importance of the specification level behind the current costs.
- d) The largest costs apply to the maintenance of Ventnor Park (£38,160) and the Cascades (£10,587) and it was acknowledged that these two areas, along with all the others on the Island classified as Principal Parks make a crucial contribution to the life of all the Island's residents and form an essential element of the Island's tourism offer and, consequently should not be a charge solely on the areas in which they are located.
- e) There will need to be more discussion about the standards to which they are maintained in order to reduce the costs and winter plantings will no longer take place but it seems likely that the maintenance of these two areas will not be a charge to Ventnor Town Council.

### **3) GRASS CUTTING**

- a) Appendix A to this report contains the areas and annual cutting costs in the Ventnor area that were supplied at the initial meeting at a total cost, including the Principal Parks, of £89,519.
- b) The amounts coloured red in the reproduction of them used here identify those areas where the grass cutting will not be a demand on the Town Council's ring fenced budget provision.
- c) These total £59,383 and reduce the maximum call on that budget provision to £30,136.
- d) That amount can be significantly reduced further by a combination of identifying any that no longer need to regularly cut and reducing the specification for those that do.

### 4) BEACH CLEANING

a) Following the initial meeting, matching information on the current costs of Beach Cleaning from Bonchurch through Ventnor to Steephill Cove have been supplied and are attached here

as Appendix B to this report in a total of £23,417.

b) The detail provided in respect of this service includes the specification for the works on each of the beaches.

### 5) **RECOMMENDATION**

- a) This is, of course, only a start! Identifying all the reductions in funding that are in the pipeline and establishing not only the current costs of each of the affected services but also the costs of alternative specifications and/or providers is going to be time consuming and require significant input of work and expertise.
- b) This was discussed at the monthly meeting of the Public Buildings Working Group on Tuesday 25 February as the group has become well established and is authoritative in its combination of experience and expertise.
- c) The Town Council is thus recommended to widen the current remit of the group to include work with the Clerks on detailing all the elements in (a) above as the basis for preparing recommendations on the detail to future meetings of the Town Council.
- d) The Group has indicated its willingness to take on this additional work.
