5) BONIFACE FIELDS

The Isle of Wight Council's Children's Services project in our Boniface Fields Allotments found publicity in the County Press:

'CHILDREN in care and those with disabilities have been brought closer to nature, thanks to a new allotment project. Launched by the Isle of Wight Council's leaving care team, the project has given children and young people an opportunity to grow their own produce.

By taking care of the plot at Ventnor's St Boniface allotments, which has wheelchair access, they have been able to learn new skills. The project also aims to promote good mental health.

Team manager Karen Cheeseman said: "This project is about the community supporting young people and children with disabilities to be involved in an allotment and learn skills in horticulture as well as socialising and networking with each other and the wider community."
