No. **DETAILS**

- I) ST CATHERINE'S SCHOOL
 - a) Jim Toogood, Andrew Hitt and I met with Tony Flowers in his role as a Trustee of the school to advance agreement about the actual area of Boniface Fields that will be leased to the school.
 - b) An arrangement we all agreed on was arrived at and the final stage will be a meeting of this group with the Isle of Wight Council's Assistant Director of Regeneration Ashley Curzon that has been arranged for Wednesday next.

2) BONIFACE FIELDS

- a) Work on the revised entrance is underway with the sight line being cleared by Tree Care and the remaining work on widening the entrance that Jim Toogood and Brian Roberts will do is planned for early February a major saving of over £10k on the original.
- b) On-site parking will soon be available!
- c) Nick Cox is currently developing a Risk Assessment for the whole site and Datawarm have been commissioned to conduct the works that have been professionally identified as necessary to reduce the risk of Legionellosis.

- a) The tenant of Room 18 has moved on after 12 months and the room now welcomes back the previous tenant of Room 11 who moved out when the Italian Shipping Company he worked for pulled its operations back to home territory.
- b) So the building's rooms are still fully occupied.
