No. DETAIL

I) APPRENTICE APPOINTMENT

- a) The recruitment and selection process for our new post of Apprentice in Business Administration concluded on 12 September with the unanimous appointment of Florence Barrett.
- b) Florence starts work with us on 13 October and will work with the Assistant Town Clerk in a combination of making an important contribution to the growing amount of administration required for the Town Council's expanding responsibilities and benefiting from on the job training.
- c) The Isle of Wight College are making arrangements for her to link up with her one day a week training programme.

2) DCLG VISIT

- a) The Isle of Wight Association of Local Council's (IWALC) had arranged for two civil servants from the Department for Communities and Local Government (DCLG) to visit the Island on 29/30 September for a look at Town and Parish Councils with a track record of implementing the localism agenda.
- b) Ventnor was included in the programme and James Kingston of DCLG, accompanied by IWALC Chair Gill Kennett and Vice-Chair June Davidson spent 1¹/₂ hours with the Mayor, Councillors Jim Toogood and Tony Marvin and the Clerks in our offices.
- c) It proved to be a valuable exchange of information and ideas as well as endorsing our already established connection the James and the DCLG.
