ISLE OF WIGHT COUNCIL'S

BUDGET

The Budget was approved at Wednesday's full Council meeting. The main points are:

- £3.5m of savings in accordance with the Council resolution of 26 February 2020.
- A Council Tax increase of 4.99% (3.0% of which is raised specifically for Adult Social Care).
- A forecast for the 3 year period beyond 2021/22 which will require a further£9.0m in savings or £3.0m pa (from £3.5m pa previously).

The Group met on Wednesday evening and began as usual with Tony McCarthy's report covering welcome donations to the town's Food Bank and Baby Box and a funding application to continue adult learning provision in partnership with Pan, Aspire and West Wight.

Support for the town's vulnerable residents, Boniface Fields, Ventnor Park and the Local Elections were also on the Agenda.

SOUTH WIGHT PARISHES FORUM

The Forum brings together representatives from the 13 Town & Parish Councils in the South Wight Area at regular intervals for discussions with senior staff from the Island's Health and Social Care services. The latest session took place virtually on Thursday afternoon with the guest speaker Sharon Kingsman, a Public Health Principal with the Isle of Wight Council for Care and lead for Public Health Commissioning, to talk about the Mental Health Alliance.

OPENING UP

Unless the government advice changes, we're planning for the re-opening of the Outdoor Gym and Paddling Pool in four weeks' time, on 29 March. Signage will be restored with reminders of the importance of observing the requirements for Covid-safety.
