LOCAL ELECTIONS 6 MAY: JOIN US?

ASSETS & SERVICES WORKING GROUP

The Secretary and a Committee member of the Ventnor Community Shed joined the latest meeting of the Group to outline proposals for the development at Boniface Fields. Other agenda items included Ventnor Park, Benches in the Park, the Group's Remit, the Putting Green and Salisbury Gardens.

MEETING WITH THE ISLAND'S MP

I joined the 33 other representatives of the Island's Town & Parish Councils for the fortnightly meeting



Bob Seely holds for us. Half the meeting this time was on the planned introduction of several pairs of Beavers to the Eastern Yar between Newchurch and Bembridge with questions to Jamie Marsh of the

Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust as agreed at the previous meeting.

Other items raised included the Isle of Wight Council ending the grant funding to Town & Parish Councils towards their Precept Budgets (they need to keep it), whether hybrid virtual meetings would be allowed after 7 May (government not decided yet), the planned closure of Chillerton's School (opposed) and the shortage of Dentists (representations made).

FEBRUARY FINANCES

The balance on the Town Council's accounts at 28 February was £194,166. During the month we paid out a total of £43,783 of which £6.801 was for Salisbury Gardens and included the second of the half yearly loan repayments for the refurbishment of the building.

We received a total of £16,952 in the month and that included £15,050 income received for Salisbury Gardens. After 11 months of the current financial year payments were £50,018 less than Budget and receipts were £5,845 under Budget.
