# LOCAL ELECTIONS: WHAT NEXT?

We've arrived at the last episode of our *Local Elections* story here with the completion of the local elections on Saturday evening when the 12 candidates for the Ventnor West Ward became six Councillors.

With thanks to all who put themselves forward for election to the Ward, the successful six included two who have been Members of the current Town Council – James Toogood and Ian Bond – and four new Members: Julie Hutchinson, Mark Jefferies, Steph Toogood and Phil Warren.

Which leaves us with a new Town Council that starts today .with nine Members and two vacancies, one in each of Bonchurch & Ventnor East and Lowtherville. Induction meetings for the four new Members will take place in the early part of this week in preparation for the planned informal initial meeting to be held virtually on Wednesday evening. The first formal meetings are the Annual Town Council Meeting, immediately followed by the May business meeting at 6pm next Monday.

As the law now requires that Council meetings are held on a physical basis rather that the virtual arrangements of the past 13 months they will be at St Margaret's Hall in Upper Ventnor.

# ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

We weren't able to hold the Annual Parish Meeting last year, but it's returning this year as the usual opportunity for residents to hear details of the work being done by the town's remarkable voluntary organisations. The meeting is required by law to take place before the end of May and as Covid safety needs to be in place this meeting will be held on-line. #### **APRIL FINANCES**

The balance on the Town Council's bank accounts at 30 April was £490,379. Payments during the month totalled £43,140 of which £3,099 was due to Salisbury Gardens. Income during the month totalled £369,901 of which £4,269 came from Salisbury Gardens' rents and £355,889 was the annual precept payment.

The list of payments and receipts in the first month of the year showed payments £3,498 under Budget and receipts £17 more than Budget.

# PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING

Our Planning Committee met on Tuesday with a longer than usual Agenda of 10 Planning Applications to assess. It agreed that it saw no reason to oppose four of them – 15 Undercliff Gardens, Ambion House, Wolverton Road, 30 Ocean View Road and Ventnor View, St Albans Road. It supported those for 17 Zig Zag Road, Bay Cottage, Belgrave Road and Orchardleigh, Shore Road. For the remaining three it imply noted the conditions being applied to the Esplanade's Beachlands and the Gaiety and 53 Gills Cliff Road.
