NEW TOWN COUNCIL - NEW APPOINTMENTS

This evening's Annual Town Council Meeting has appointed Councillor Stephen Cockett as Mayor for this year with Councillor Steph Toogood as Deputy Mayor. Their appointments run until the Town Council's Annual Meeting of May 2022.

Membership of the Town Council's two Committees was also agreed with Councillors Julie Hutchinson, James Toogood, Phil Warren and Steph Toogood on the Planning Committee and Councillors James Toogood and Ian Bond as the Staffing Committee.

DUDLEY ROAD CAR PARK

Island Roads have again requested the use of a part of Dudley Road Car Park for use by the heavy equipment

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

The Town Council's Annual Accounts on the required Income and Expenditure basis as presented to this evening's Meeting recorded total income of £504,749 for the financial year 2020/2021 with the Precept providing £360,589 (71%). Expenditure in the year came to a total of ££461,355.
