PLANNING COMMITTEE MEETING

The Group's meeting on Tuesday had eight applications on its Agenda. It recorded its assessment of 'no reason to oppose' for the two in respect of Nirvana, Steephill Court Road and supported four: 69 Leeson Road, Westfield Lodges and Apartments in Shore Road, Friston, Bonchurch Shute and 5 Inglewood Park, St Lawrence.

It opposed an application for a single storey extension



tion for a single storey extension to 15 Undercliff Gardens 'based on the limitation of front access and reduction in parking.' The Group's strongest opposition applied to the addition of a balcony to Esplanade Road's Sea Gem which it judged

'The property is located in a Conservation Area; the glazing on the sides of the balcony is not obscure and the structure overlooks many neighbouring properties, providing lack of privacy to residents.'
