TOWN MAYOR 2022-23

Monday evening's Annual Town Council Meeting unanimously appointed Councillor Steph Toogood to



the role of Town Mayor and therefore Chair of the Town Council for the coming 12 months having served as Deputy Mayor for the past year.

Last year's Mayor, Stephen Cockett, was unanimously elected as Deputy Mayor for

this year. Other appointments included Councillor Phil Warren as Chair of our Planning Committee and Co33uncillor Ian Bond as Staffing Committee Chair.

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

This meeting that followed the short Annual Town Council Meeting was a celebration of Ventnor's amazing range of voluntary organisations with short pressentations of their work by the Wellbeing Café, Ventnor Community Shed, Ventnor Heritage Museum, Ventnor Enhancement Fund, our Youth Club, the Flower Fairy, Ventnor Community Foodbank, Baby Box and the Carnival. We also welcomed the Principal of St Catherine's School and College's outline of their remarkable work.

PLANNING COMMITTEE

Tuesday's meeting of our Planning Committee supported five of the seven applications on its Agenda. The application for change of use of the former Waterside Café on the Esplanade to two residential buildings however was strongly opposed as *It is incompatible with the Isle of Wight Council's Core Strategy Policies. Ventnor Town Council would like to see it return to a successfully run business ...to prevent the detrimental effect of amenities on the seafront.* The Isle of Wight Council granted it prior planning approval on Friday. The Committee said it would support a rear extension at 1a Southgrove Terrace *subject to approval from Building Regulations ...regarding limited space, access, and egress for safety reasons.*

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS

Tonight's Town Council meeting will receive the Income and Expenditure Accounts for the financial year 2021/22. These include adjustments to include expenditure that will be made this year but was for activities in last year and exclude income received last year that is actually for activity this year.

They show income during 2021/22 for that year's work to have been £521,333 with expenditure arising from that activity totalling £547,802. The resulting deficit for the year represents an investment of part of the surplus produced during 2020/21 of £43,394.
