ISLAND HOUSING COSTS

The Isle of Wight Council has received the latest *Local Housing Needs Assessment* commissioned



from the Capita-owned GL Hearn consultancy. It includes disturbing figures on the

relationship between wages and both house purchase prices and rents, especially for poorer residents.

House purchasing

With a median (average) property price of £255,000, a household income of approximately £54,188 is required. For cheapest 25% of houses it is assumed that a household must earn at least £39,950. So it is estimated that 96% of households are unable to afford median property prices, and 85% are unable to afford the entry-level, lower quartile costs.

Renting

The lower quartile rent is £550 per month. In terms of the income needed to afford an annual rental cost of £6,600...this would equate to an annual household income requirement of £25,385.
