Welcome to edition 116 of our Clerk's Column circulated as usual to the 490 residents on our Residents' Forum email list and through the Chronicle's page 4.

JUNE FINANCIALS

The total of our two Bank Accounts at 30 June was £442,490. The major item in the month's total expenditure of £77,819 was the £25,687 for the work on the new public toilet, bringing the total cost of that to date to £137, 367. We also made the first of the loan repayments for those works at £3,770. There was also a payment of £2,470 for repairs to the Esplanade toilet. Salisbury Gardens' costs totalled £2,780.

Receipts during June came to £16,848 of which £8,544 came from Salisbury Gardens' rents and £1,735 was the annual payment from the Isle of Wight Council towards our Beach Cleaning costs.

Payments during the first quarter of the financial year were £6,741 more than Budget with receipts in that period £956 over Budget.

JULY'S TOWN COUNCIL MEETING

This evening's meeting includes the Finance Report, Ventnor Park signage, possible membership of the Island's Chamber of Commerce and the Town Council's Major Projects Programme.

COASTAL COMMUNITIES FUND REPORT

'The government published last week its final evaluation of its Coastal Communities Fund from which our successful application provided £95,000 towards the cost of refurbishing Salisbury Gardens in 2014. We are one of 21 case studies quoted: Ventnor Town Council refurbished and reconfigured the Coastal Enterprise Centre to provide office space for business start-ups and self-employed workers. However, beyond the business impacts the increased visibility of the Town Council was mentioned as a key success... As a result of the Centre being built, residents knew where to go to receive and offer support....Stakeholders felt that these benefits were especially important because of the high levels of deprivation within the area, so there needed to be an accessible location point where people can go for assistance. The profits from this project were reinvested back into the local community.'
