- The <u>All Party Parliamentary Group</u> has published the results of its Inquiry into in-work poverty: 'More than 20% of the UK workforce are paid below the Real Living Wage ... nearly half (45%) of all supermarket workers paid below the Real Living Wage.'
- <u>Stepchange</u> reports 'a significant number of parents also expect they will have to sell personal or household items to make ends meet this summer – 19% of all parents said they will do this, with this figure almost doubling for parents on Universal Credit.'
