ASSETS & SERVICES WORKING GROUP

The first item on the Agenda of Tuesday morning's meeting was the completion of the remaining works on the new Public Toilet and related agreement to open them on Monday 8 August. The poor condition of the Park's Tulip Tree was next with discussion of the proposals for its treatment following the previous day's meeting with the Isle of Wight Council officers responsible for the Park's trees.

Agreement to renew the timing mechanism for the Cascade lighting was followed by concerns about the staining of the urinals in the Esplanade Toilets and a decision to acquire quotations for their replacement. We were pleased to be able to respond to a request for a contribution to this year's carnival fireworks with £250 towards their greatly increased costs this year. We then noted that the major work involved in redirecting the water flow that had made the Shore Road Toilets inaccessible for several months had now been completed and that after leaving them for a month to dry out we would establish the costs of restoring them.
