#### INVITATION TO FAMILY VOICE VIEWING

was unanimously agreed it should be shown as widely as possible. Because it is a Ventnor film its first public viewing will be for the town's residents and that has been arranged for Monday 3 October at St Catherine's Church at 6pm.

Made by local professional film and documentary

makers Utility Films, it surfaces the poverty within the town through interviews with users of WHY HAVE I GOT THESE CHILDREN IF I CAN'T GIVE THEM WHAT THEY NEED ?

Ventnor Food Bank, Baby Box and the Town Council's Food and Fuel vouchers. The viewing will be followed by discussions that we hope will produce a range of ideas for responding to it.

#### ASSETS & SERVICES WORKING GROUP

The Group's latest meeting on Tuesday opened with the arrangements for CCTV coverage of the outside of the new Public Toilet and Spring Hill Garden followed by agreement to close the Park toilets for just January and February instead of the whole winter. We then heard that the Isle of Wight Council had been reminded that the Marlborough Road toilets were being returned to them from 1 October. The repair work on the damaged Fountain in Spring Hill Garden was agreed to start next week. It was also agreed to provide free car parking in the four car parks the Town Council manages all day on 10 December for the Christmas in Ventnor events. The increased cost of watering the flowers on the central reservation was a matter of concern and the advice from the Isle of Wight Council about their Ash Dieback works at Smugglers' Haven was noted.

The other Agenda items for last Monday's meeting were the draft lease for the four spaces in the Central Car Park now occupied by the new Toilet and the twinning of that Toilet with one in Zambia.
