Welcome to edition 133 of our Clerk's Column circulated as usual to the 490 residents on our Residents' Forum email list and through the Chronicle's page 4.

## **OCTOBER FINANCES**

The total of our two Bank Accounts at 31 October was  $\pounds 269,787$ . Expenditure during the month of October totalled  $\pounds 41,527$  including Salisbury Gardens' costs of  $\pounds 3,759$ . The two largest non-salary costs were the monthly payment of  $\pounds 2,281$  to John O'Connor for our Grounds Maintenance works and  $\pounds 1,472$  for the water bill at the Eastern Esplanade Toilets.

Receipts during October came to £16,692 of which £4,791 came from Salisbury Gardens' rents. The receipts included the VAT refund for the July to September quarter of £7,968. We had expected to also receive the insurance payment due to us of £9,068 for the storm damage to Salisbury Gardens in October last year, but that arrived on 1 November.

The total spent during the first seven months of the current financial year was £26,965 more than budgeted for while receipts in the same period were £11,285 above budget.

#### MAYOR'S CHARITY AUCTION

Our Mayor, Steph Toogood, has organised a Charity



l'oogood, has organised a Charity Auction to raise funds to support local providers of Warm Spaces this winter. It's on Saturday 19 November at the Met on the Esplanade starting at 7pm. The Venue and the Entertainment have been provided free of charge and the latter includes a Star Contribution by The Hillmans

with Dick Taylor. There are a wide range of items in place for auction on the night and, as the Mayor says: *Local businesses have generously donated lots of auction items. It's a fun night- it's a musical night- do come and join us and bid. This will help us with heating costs for "Warm Spaces" in Ventnor during the cold months* 

#### LIVING WELL FUNDING

We are pleased to have received £5,000 funding for our participation in and support (through Tony McCarthy's involvement) for the Living Well Project during its first year.

## **REMEMBRANCE SERVICES**

Ventnor's two annual services of Remembrance take place this coming weekend:

Friday 11 November, 10.45, Royal British Legion

The road will be temporarily closed throughout the short service and to honour the two minutes silence. The service will be followed by a 40-



minute talk covering the history, role and scope of caring for the town's war dead, both at home in the UK and across the world.

The 2pm service at St Catherine's Church will be followed by the Laying of Wreaths ceremony at Ventnor's War Memorial, Park Avenue. Due to road closures, people should make their own way to the War Memorial.
