SEA WALL REPAIRS

The Mayor and I had a Zoom meeting on

Wednesday with the Isle of Wight Council's Strategic Manager Environment & Waste Natasha Dix about the repairs to the sea wall.



She told us that the Emergency stage of the works was almost complete at a government funded cost of around £500,000 and that the Urgent Stage has begun. That is expected to take 8 to 10 months. She is arranging with us for another public meeting on the matter to be held in mid-February.
