TOWN MEETING 2023

The annual Town Meeting is open to all Ventnor's residents as an opportunity to hear from leaders of the town's voluntary organisations and comment on or ask questions about the Town Council's work.

This year's is being held at St Catherine's Church on Monday evening 15 May immediately following the short (usually 15 minutes) Annual Town Council Meeting that starts at 6pm. That meeting appoints the Mayor for the coming 12 month's and she or he will then Chair the Annual Town Meeting.

Organisations providing short outlines of their activity are likely to include: Baby Box, Community Pantry, Ventnor Community Foodbank, Ventnor Well-being Café, Ventnor Carnival Association Friends of Ventnor Botanic Gardens, Friends of Ventnor Cemetery, Ventnor Coastguard, Living Well, Early Help and Better Days Café.

BONCHURCH CELEBRATES

The Bonchurch Community Association held their Coronation picnic on Sunday and they found the



only sunshine of the weekend. Two hundred residents attended and were entertained by local musicians in

a very relaxed atmosphere, raising their glasses to the new King and Queen.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT FUND COMMITTEE

The Committee met on Thursday, beginning with a report showing that as at 30 April the Fund had received a total of £38,345 of which the Committee had distributed £29,245 leaving a balance at that point of £9,100. This promoted a discussion of the future of the Fund as the level of contributions to it had fallen to just £350 in April. The Clerk then reported on the meeting he and the Mayor had the previous day with the Better Days Café to agree the information the Town Council – as with all grant making organisations – would need from them as the basis for a grant application. It was noted that no application for a grant had yet been received.
